Introduction

Thanks to everyone who took part in the recent residents survey issued by the Community Council. Questionnaires were sent out to all 316 households on the electoral register and 92 were returned, which is a fantastic response rate of just under 30%. The winner of the £10 shopping voucher will be pulled (by one of our Angus Council elected representatives) from the names of all of those who participated at the next community council meeting on 25 August.

One of the main suggestions was that we do a village newsletter again. You may remember that we had twice yearly newsletters many years ago, but the problem has always been getting willing volunteers to pull it together on a regular basis. So our thanks go to the website team of Sandra Burke and Kerry Kirkland for also offering to do the newsletter.

Survey Results Summary

71% of respondents knew about the Community Council, with 46% having a good idea what it does. 50% felt part of the community and 50% unfortunately didn't. Reasons *for* feeling part of the community were:

- Involved with children and the school
- Participate in local events and at the hall
- Have friends and good neighbours here

“It's a friendly community”

Reasons for *not* feeling part of the community included:

- Don't know what's going on
- People keeping to themselves
- Live outside main concentration of housing
- Lack of regular news

“We have too much work elsewhere which keeps us fully occupied”

What folk like about living in Tealing

There was lots of agreement on this, with the following themes coming up again and again:

- Quiet rural living
- Lovely scenery and countryside
- Not far from other towns and cities
- Everybody is friendly
- Plenty living space
- Good neighbours
- Birds, wildlife, horses and farm animals
- Great place to bring up children
- Good school, friendly church

What folk don't like about living in Tealing

The majority (two thirds of respondents) couldn't think of *anything* they don't like about living in Tealing. In fact, one gutsy resident took exception to this question and said -

“Let me know anyone who said that and I'll sort them out!

The themes for things people *don't* like though were also quite consistent and included –

- Dual carriageway – difficulty crossing on foot, dangers of entering and leaving the junctions, talk of a Dundee city bypass
- No village centre shop or post office
- Speeding cars on the side roads
- Lack of proper footpaths
- Poor public transport, must drive everywhere
- Heavy goods vehicle traffic
- Older people can become isolated
- Horse droppings on the roads



Being realistic, what new or improved facilities would you like to see?

On the whole residents were realistic about the improvements that would make living in Tealing even better. The following list will provide plenty for community councilors, local elected representatives, Angus Council and other decision making bodies to consider over the coming years. It includes –

- 50mph speed limit on a stretch of the A90
- 30mph speed limit on School Road
- Regular village newsletter
- Several times daily bus service covering more of the side roads, more bus stops
- Corner shop or post office
- Shuttle bus to Morrisons
- Outdoor bowling club or tennis courts with clubhouse
- Annual Gala Day or Fete to bring folk together and raise funds
- More pavements and footpaths
- Community use of the school buildings
- Walk way connecting Inveraldie to the Auchterhouse Road
- Roadside improvements to remove eyesore buildings
- Mains gas and mains drainage
- Improved broadband
- Playpark near the school
- Skatepark in Inveraldie
- Speed control on Newbigging Road
- More recycling facilities, refuse skips
- Youth club, badminton, yoga, music classes
- More communication and consultation
- More affordable housing

We can't expect any of these things overnight, but the Community Council will make arrangements to

consult further with residents to decide on what should be the main priorities for the coming years. The current Community Council term of office ends this Autumn and there will be local elections to form a new Community Council in October. This survey has certainly provided really good information and suggestions for the new Community Council to get their teeth into!

"I've traced my relatives back to Tealing in the 1700s and will keep in touch!"


