# **HOW WELL DO YOU KNOW TEALING?**

Population:775 (63% working age, 18% children, 19% pension age)

Home ownership: 74%, rented housing 26%

Households: 250, working farms 9 How long living in the village:

(20+yrs 56%, 10-20 yrs 20%, 10 yrs or less 24%)

This is just some of the data from the last residents survey done by Angus Council in 2012. Back then, residents said the best things about living here were that it was quiet, safe, had low crime and was a peaceful, friendly, clean and well-kept rural setting. The three things that people said they most wanted to see improve were road safety and paths, waste management and recycling and community amenities.

Some of these views will still resonate but, as the last survey is now ten years old, it would be good to find out how the village population has changed and what the social, economic and environmental concerns are now. We plan therefore to survey residents again in 2022 and everyone will have the opportunity to participate and have their say.

### **COMMUNITY MATTERS**

Tealing Community Council (TCC) is pushing for a safe walking route to the school from the corner of Huntingfaulds Road and for improvements to the verges on the A90. We're disappointed there was no mention of these in the recent Angus Council paper and so a letter has been sent to the Chief Executive of Angus Council.

TCC was given some preliminary information on speeding on the Tealing Auchterhouse road, which indicated that 85% of traffic was doing 40mph or less. As the rest were well over 40mph, TCC is working with the Community Policing team to try to get more police monitoring of traffic driving through the area - especially those ignoring the 20mph limit.

We're also investigating the possibility of planting a 'Jubilee Tree' at the school, and are awaiting a response from Angus Council.


