PETTERDEN WOODLAND UPDATE

Several development trust members responded to the survey about whether to accept the offer to gift this small area of woodland from the Fothringham Estate and were generally in favour of its potential for community use. We also sought professional advice from forestry experts and spoke with nearby residents. This revealed some serious limitations - particularly in relation to access, parking, adjacent commercial activity plus recurring storm damage to many trees over the years. On balance, the TDT board has decided not to proceed at this location. Scottish Forestry also pointed out that there's a 50-acre award-winning community woodland (open to all) just 6 miles away at Dronley Wood. Find out more at https:// dronleywood.org

ROAD SAFETY



COMMUNITY COUNCIL UPDATE

There's much to reflect on since the last newsletter. The increasing use of Tealing Hall demonstrates the efforts of the local community to celebrate and make use of this space. The various fundraising and social events are a real source of pride and the installation of the defibrillator at the hall is much welcome. We're working to have more installed around Tealing and the next one will be situated at Tealing Primary School.



Regarding issues raised with the community council, foremost recently there has been some serious road traffic accidents on the A90 at the dangerous crossing points across the carriageway. Previous efforts to engage with BEAR Scotland (who are responsible for the road) and Angus Council, plus their representatives, have seen us presented with many reasons why there is no impetus to change speed limits, review the need for slip roads or create a bridge over or under the road.

It's deeply frustrating for TCC and others to hear all of these excuses, while constantly worrying that further fatalities and life-changing accidents might be prevented. Locals have demonstrated (through STIG for example) that there are strong voices in Tealing willing to campaign to change the perception of external agencies and to force them to engage constructively with residents. This feels like the right time to mobilise a similar group to push the urgent matter of road safety to those who can influence a change in attitude from the decision makers. We know this can be done if local feeling is strong enough. With that in mind, we'd like to know how you think this should be tackled and to hear who will come forward to help.


SCHOOL NEWS

We really appreciate a member of the community and a parent coming in each Wednesday to support our Pupil Groups as well as Ken, who is a volunteer helping us with our grounds. The Reading Pupil Group are enjoying a block of knitting and the Digital Group are going to be doing some coding. We're very close to having our Silver Rights Respecting Schools inspection soon too.
