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PATHS SURVEY

Thanks to everyone who responded to the survey and came along to the small event on 2 March in the hall to discuss the feedback. Backing for the most popular routes was:



Inveraldie to Kirkton of Tealing 72% From the school to the A90 66% The Speckled Hen to the Shielhill Road 64%

Several other paths and trails with potential to come back into use were also suggested by individuals. We'll keep those in mind, especially if they're easy to clear up and the landowners are supportive, but the main focus will be on the top three. Angus Council has agreed to consider the school to A90 roadside path as part of the larger Angus Active Routes 2025 initiative. Our community coordinator, Gillian Barclay, is looking into the possibility of getting feasibility studies done for the other two paths and can be contacted at gillian@otbds.org or 07748 075014. We're also talking to PATHS FOR ALL SCOTLAND and the National Lottery for advice and potential help with funding. We've learned from other places in Scotland that path projects can take many years to implement, but this is clearly a priority for residents and so we'll press on.

TEALING HALL AS A COMMUNITY HUB

The consultant's report by Alan Jones Associates is now complete and the hall trustees are carefully considering the conclusions and recommendations. Thanks to everyone who responded to the online survey and took part in the interviews. The good news is that the hall is structurally sound, but requires fairly significant upgrading and refurbishment if it is to become a dynamic community hub - open more often and with improved facilities and more regular activities. That's what the majority of residents who responded said they wanted. A comprehensive refurbishment of the building and car park could cost over £500K, so there's a lot to think about. TCC MEETING UPDATES

At the community council meeting on 21st February, we had representatives from Banks Renewables (soon to be OnPath Energy), the business proposing the Fithie Energy Park (battery storage) in Tealing. The company is keen to work with the local community and welcomed questions on the night – 11 residents were in attendance as well as the community councillors. The key points from the Q+A session were:

- Timeline May/June consultation with the community > designs to be submitted for consultation with TCC and residents > circa January 2025 planning application to be submitted.
- If approved, work on site would not begin until after SSEN begin building the second power station at Balkemback.
- Up to 560 containers could be placed in the Balnuith area (size of each approx. ½ shipping container).



COMMUNITY CONSULTATIONS

On Thursday 7 March, community councillors and a large number of residents went along to the SSEN Consultation Event regarding the Kintore-Tealing 400kV Projects in Tealing Hall. A resident asked that the community council facilitate a Public Meeting to allow the community to discuss the issues and concerns about the second substation and battery storage proposals. The meeting was arranged for Thursday 14th March and over thirty residents attended. As a result, an Action Group has been set up to take forward the many concerns expressed.

We also took part in the Tealing Hall SCIO meeting on 14 March to hear a summary of the report and recommendations arising from the recent Appraisal carried out by consultants about the future of the hall.

SEAGREEN COMMUNITY BENEFIT FUND
