LOCAL BUS SERVICE



We met with representatives of Angus Council Roads & Transport team and Councillor Lloyd Melville to discuss the concerns of local residents about changes to the Bus Service no. 139. Hopefully many of you will have completed the bus service consultation that was available online or managed to meet with Hong Zhang, Communities Officer when she was in Tealing on Monday 26th June. Angus Council will collate all the answers and comments and will be meeting with local councillors in August to discuss the design of the new service – with the result be made public hopefully by mid-September. The community council was reassured that the issues and concerns we raised are being taken seriously and we're confident that the council will do all they can to deliver the best service possible within their financial constraints.

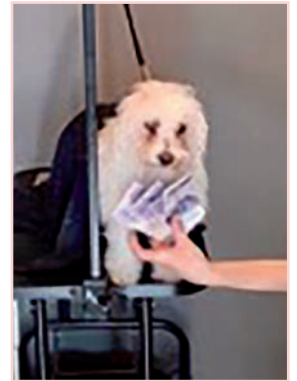
